

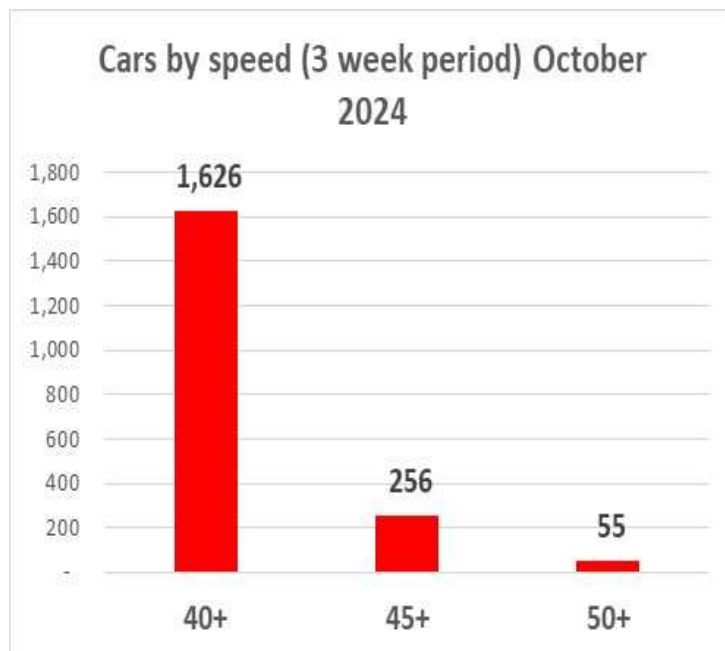
Parish Speeding (October 2024 Data)

Matfield Hall: facing Kippings Cross

Traffic flows: Average daily traffic flow (one-way only) was around 3,500, 25% above last month's level now that resurfacing is over.

Speeders: In the 21-day period, nearly 8,500 cars (or 11%) were over the "police" speed limit of 35 mph.

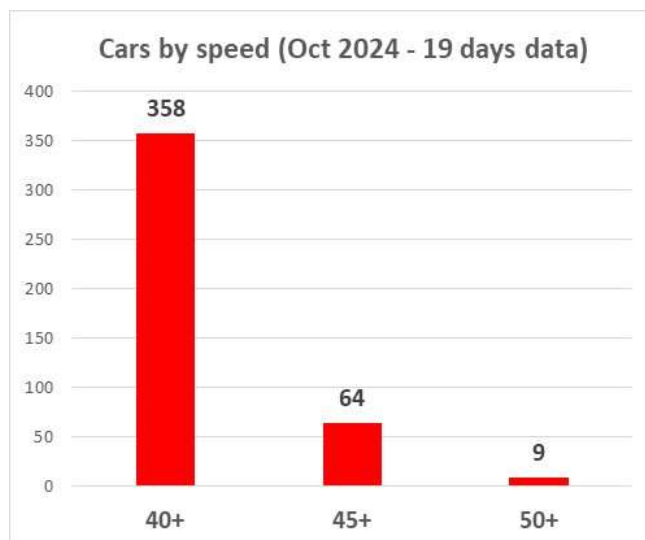
Dangerous speeds: The 55 cars exceeding 50 mph did so mainly during the late evening and very early morning. But one recorded a speed of over 60 mph around noon on Wednesday October 2nd and two exceeded 50 mph at 8am in the morning (13th & 16th October).



Coppers Lane junction: facing Matfield

Based on 19 days of data, the daily number of cars (one way only) was around 2,300, 15% below last month.

Speeders: 6% of cars (2,600 in 19 days) were above the 35mph police "official" speeding limit, close to the normal level for this site. This site tends to have a lower percentage of speeders than other sites as it is close to a junction and a blind bend so drivers take a little more care.



Dangerous speeds: However, there were still around 360 cars over 40 mph and 64 over 45 mph. Astonishingly, given the nature of the road, two cars managed to do over 55 mph. Even more surprisingly, both cars achieved this speed at around 4 pm on Sunday October 6th. It is possible they were racing each other as they were "captured" in the same 5-minute period.
